

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Introduction

Keys used in Roman Missal

[.....]	Word in between square brackets is spoken but not signed, as it is already implicit in signs/expressions.
{.....}	Word in between italicised curly brackets suggests sign for preceding words(s) ie. suggestion for signer.
Hosanna	Word in bold print means it is the response of all congregation.
<u>my</u>	Word underlined means it is signed/expressed with emphasis.
Creed is said/signed.	Rubric/instruction in red guiding the clergy.

Graphic symbols

{↑}	=	God
{↗}	=	Jesus
{↖} or {→}	=	clergy or people

There are new signs which have been created such as

{↖↖}	glory
{↖↖↗↗}	glorify
{↖↖ ↗↗ }	praise

As Latin and Greek prayers (eg *Kyrie* and *Agnus Dei*) are now sometimes sung during a Mass, these texts are included with the translated English words on the

following line to enable Sign Interpreters/Support Workers to be better able to translate these into sign language for the benefit of the signing Deaf congregation.

The *Addendum* (at the end of the Mass, after ‘blessings and prayers over the people’) also gives the Latin and English in columns side by side as an alternative. We welcome your comments and suggestions to enable us to continue improve the adaptation of the Roman Missal into sign language.

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
